Beyond Borders, Towards Peace

Event structure :

When conflict erupts, it is often civilians who bear its greatest consequences. The United Nations Human Rights Council invites delegates to deliberate upon the protection of human rights during civil unrest and armed conflicts, addressing violations of International Humanitarian Law and strengthening mechanisms for civilian protection. As nations navigate the boundaries between security, sovereignty, and human dignity, the Council must ask: how can humanity be protected when peace itself is under threat?

- **First Round:** All participants must complete the questionnaire before submitting the form.
- **Second Round: Overview: Group Discussion + Personal Interview**
Participants will engage in a group discussion to assess their communication, reasoning, and teamwork, followed by a personal interview evaluating confidence and knowledge.
- **Final Round : Overview: Main Conference**
Shortlisted delegates will participate in a simulated Model UN Committee, representing nations, debating agendas, drafting resolutions, and building consensus.
- **For students of classes : 6TH TO 12TH STD**

Rules and regulations :

- 1) The candidates are required to pay a registration fee of Rs 100/- for the event.
- 2) The fee is non-refundable and non-transferable.
- 3) Unsigned and incomplete form will not be accepted; Also carry them on the day of event.
